2016 Design Award Jurors



Barry Bergdoll is the Meyer Schapiro Professor in the Department of Art History and Archaeology at Columbia University and a curator in the Department of Architecture and Design at the Museum of Modern Art (MoMA). Professor Bergdoll's interests center on modern architectural history, with an emphasis on France and Germany since 1750. He has studied

questions of the politics of cultural representation in architecture, the larger ideological content of nineteenth-century architectural theory, and the changing role of architecture both as a profession and as a cultural product in nineteenth-century European society. In exhibitions at the Canadian Centre for Architecture and at the Museum of Modern Art, where he served as Philip Johnson Chief Curator from 2007 to 2013, Bergdoll organized exhibitions on Mies van der Rohe, the Bauhaus, Henri Labrouste, Le Corbusier, Latin American post-war architecture, and Frank Lloyd Wright. Bergdoll has participated in several major international architectural exhibitions: "Mies in Berlin," shown in New York, Barcelona, and Berlin; "Le Panthéon: Symbole des Révolutions," shown in Montreal and Paris; and "Les Vaudoyers: une dynastie d'architectes" at the [Musée d'Orsay](#) in Paris. In addition to these exhibitions, while at MoMA, Bergdoll co-curated "Foreclosed: Rehousing the American Dream" and "Rising Currents: Projects for New York's Waterfront."



Alex Krieger, FAIA

Alex Krieger has combined a career of teaching and practice, dedicating himself in both to improving the quality of place and life in our major urban areas. Alex is the founding Principal of Chan Krieger Sieniewicz which merged with NBBJ in 2009. He is a Professor at the Harvard Graduate School of Design, where he has taught since 1977. During his tenure he has served as Chairman of the Department of Urban Planning and Design, Director of the Urban Design Program, and Associate Chairman of the Department of Architecture. Alex is a frequent advisor to mayors and their planning staffs, and serves on a number of boards and commissions. Among these: Director of the NEA's Mayor's Institute in City Design; Boston Civic Design Commission; Providence Capital Center Commission; and the New England Holocaust Memorial committee. In September 2012, President Barack Obama appointed Alex to serve on the U.S. Commission of Fine Arts.



Sara Lopergolo, AIA

is a Partner at Selldorf Architects and a licensed architect with 25 years of experience. Ms. Lopergolo has been with the firm for fifteen years. She works closely with Annabelle Selldorf on the design for all of the firm's major projects including large-scale new construction and cultural facilities. Ms. Lopergolo has significant experience with ground-up construction having served as Partner-in-Charge on all of the

firm's condominium designs, as well as other large-scale projects such as the Sunset Park Material Recovery Facility in Brooklyn and the David Zwirner Gallery. She received a Bachelor of Architecture from Syracuse University, and has studied and worked in England, Italy, and Japan.

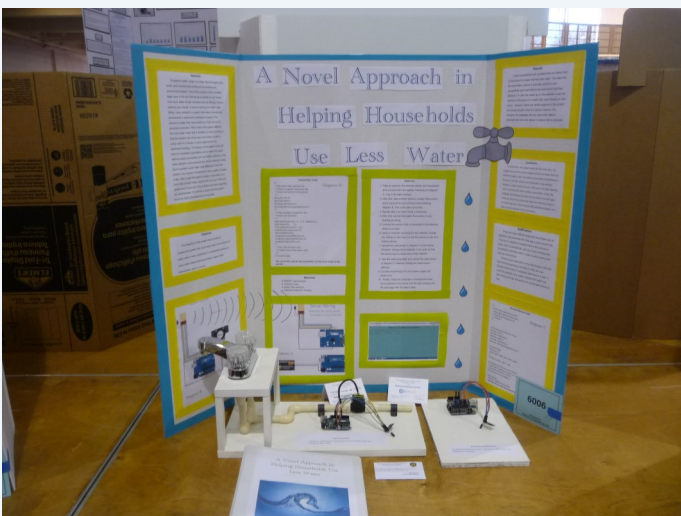
Mike is survived by his wife Corrine and his son Alexandre. AIA Extends its most sincere sympathy to his family, friends and colleagues.

Science Fair Winners

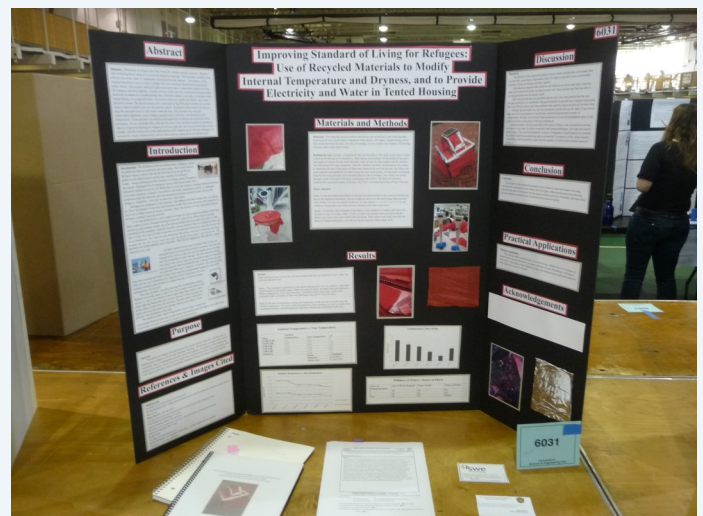
