Scholarships Announced

The Connecticut Architecture Foundation Inc. was established by the Connecticut Chapter of The American Institute of Architects in 1978. This organization's mission is to raise the public awareness of, and expectations for, Architecture and the built environment. We accomplish these goals through the funding of programs in education, scholarship, mentorship and research. Our administration of the Foundation's Scholarship Program is an important part of that work.

Eligibility

- In order to be considered for a Foundation Scholarship a candidate must complete by **June 30, 2017** two years in a NAAB accredited Architectural Program leading to a B-ARCH degree.
- A student who is currently enrolled in non-accredited undergraduate program but has been accepted to a NAAB accredited Masters Program (M-ARCH) is also eligible for consideration.
- All students in NAAB accredited Masters Programs are eligible.
- Only full time students will be considered.
- The applicant must demonstrate some connection to the state of Connecticut (residence, school, work, etc).

Charles DuBose Scholarship

Students who have completed two years in accredited undergraduate architectural programs or have been accepted into an accredited graduate program are eligible to apply for this scholarship. Connecticut residents are encouraged to apply. Preference will be given to students at the University of Pennsylvania, Georgia Institute of Technology, and the Fontainebleau summer program.

The Charles DuBose Scholarship Fund was established in 1986 by DuBose Associates, Inc. of Hartford, Connecticut in memory of Charles DuBose, FAIA. Ruth DuBose, Widow of Mr. Charles DuBose, has contributed substantially to the scholarship fund. Charles DuBose, Founder and Chairman of DuBose Associates, Inc. Architects, was most noted for his design of Constitution Plaza in Hartford. It was acclaimed in the 1960's as one of the first urban developments to effectively separate pedestrian movement from vehicular traffic with a series of raised landscaped terraces.

Sheng Fund Scholarship

Students who have completed two years in accredited undergraduate architectural programs or have been accepted into an accredited graduate program are eligible to apply for this scholarship. Connecticut residents are encouraged to apply. Preference will be given to students at Cornell University

Scholarship awards have previously ranged between \$1,200 and \$5,000.

Deadline (postmarked): April 29, 2017



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To apply for one of these scholarships, send all of the following, in one envelope:

1. Application
2. A one-page letter describing your accomplishments and goals
3. A one-to-two page resume of education, experience, honors, activities, interests and Connecticut affiliation
4. A completed Financial Aid form, signed and completed by the Financial Aid institution attending. Your school's Financial Aid Officer must complete the relevant sections and sign the form.
5. Two faculty letters of reference on college or university stationary sealed in envelopes. References from employers or others will not be accepted.
6. Submit one exemplary project including description of project, drawings/media depicting project and an explanation of the rationale for your design. Materials will not be returned. (By submitting this application, you grant permission to The Connecticut Architecture Foundation, Inc. to reproduce any or all of your materials for the promotion of its programs.)

In addition, please note:

1. Applications must include current email address, contact information and telephone number
2. If confirmation of acceptance of award is not received in writing within 30 days of award notification, the award offering will be revoked.
3. If application is incomplete or does not comply with stated requirements, application will be disqualified.
