# The Connecticut American Institute of Architects Announces the 2024 Architecture Awards

(New Haven, CT, November 17, 2024) The Connecticut Chapter of the American Institute of Architects (AIA Connecticut) will host its 2024 Annual Awards Gala on December 12th at Cascade in Hamden, CT.

This prestigious event celebrates excellence in residential and commercial architecture, the transformative power of design, and the achievements of emerging professionals who have made outstanding contributions to the field. It also honors individuals and groups for their significant impact on the architecture profession and the organization.

From 210 submissions, 50 awards will be presented to individuals and firms, culminating in the announcement of the **Project of the Year**, selected by the Design Awards Jury. The evening will also recognize members celebrating 25and 50-year milestones of AIA membership.
